

PROPOSAL to EDF by SPLG

Monitoring committee for the nuclear building programme

AIM

“A. To provide a monitoring committee to oversee the effects upon the local community of the largest building programme in the UK”

B. “To raise awareness and/or instigate solutions of local issues with providers such as EDF and/or other local services”

MONITORING OBJECTIVES

1. To review training and employment opportunities for adults and young people at the building site.
2. To update the level of transport movements and state of roads to the site.
3. To monitor noise and pollution at or near the building site.
4. To review the impact of worker provided accommodation.
5. To collect any evidence of criminal activity and propose preventive measures.
6. To address the possible impact of immigration tensions with and between workers from other countries and parts of the UK.
7. To monitor the impact on the economic and social life of the community.
8. To regularly review the impact upon local Health Services.
9. To be aware of the potential stress upon housing costs and needs.
10. To measure the impact upon the environment surrounding the building site, including wildlife and their habitats, landscape features within the AONB & SSSI, water & sea defenses.
11. To introduce issues that the Monitoring Committee are at present unaware.

TENURE OF THE MONITORING COMMITTEE

Duration of the Sizewell C building programme.

FINANCE

Annual administration, secretarial and expenses costs to be met by EDF.

MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE

The Monitoring Committee should consist of representatives from the following organizations: Suffolk CC, Suffolk Coastal DC, Sizewell Parishes Liaison Group, Police, Suffolk Youth Offending Service, Health Service, Housing Trust, Environment Agency, Youth Services, Training provider and EDF.

The Monitoring Committee to meet regularly, prepare reports and present issues to the appropriate bodies. The Committee to elect its own Chairperson and Secretary.
